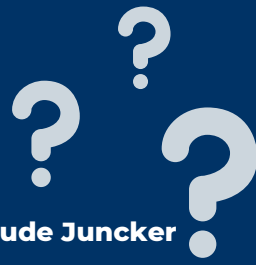


# What is the European Pillar of Social Rights?

### Principle 1. Education, training and life-long learning

#### EPR recommends:

Improving access to quality VET for PWD



Promote cooperation between the labour market and VET actors

VET services need to update on trends and adapt their programmes and curricula, in cooperation with businesses!



### Principle 3. Equal opportunities

#### EPR recommends:

Campaigns to combat discrimination, stereotyping and prejudices



Actions that show individualised approaches to support in work and society can benefit all people, should be put in place



### PRINCIPLE 4. ACTIVE SUPPORT TO EMPLOYMENT

#### EPR recommends:

Creating inclusive labour markets through effective employment programmes



Ensuring PWD can access labour guidance from persons that understand disability



### Principle 18. Long-term care

#### EPR recommends:

Good practice in community-based services should be showcased

Ensure support for both informal and formal care, and mixed and flexible services

Training of staff providing long-term care to be able to support different disabilities
