## How can EPR members promote the developments of digital skills?

## Programme

## Background

In January 2018, the EU Commissioner for the Digital Economy and Society claimed "the digital age is expanding into all areas of our lives, and it is not just those who work in IT that will need to be alert of the digital transformation. The digital skills gap is real. While already 90% of future jobs require some level of digital literacy, 44% of Europeans lack basic digital skills". The Digital Education Action Plan, launched in January 2018, focuses on the implementation and the need to stimulate, support and scale up purposeful use of digital and innovative education practices. The Action plan is relevant for a variety of stakeholders and will include also non formal education. The key priorities are

- I: Making better use of digital technology for teaching and learning
- 2: Developing relevant digital competences and skills for the digital transformation
- 3: Improving education through better data analysis and foresight

Digital skills are also at the core of the New Skills Agenda for Europe, with the creation of the Digital Skills and Jobs Coalition to improve the digital skills of the wider population.

Members of the EPR Working on Employment have identified "digital skills" as a key topic for both staff and also for people with disabilities. Likewise, members of the EPR Working group on VET expressed a keen interest in the topic of digital skills, focusing on how to be training people in digital skills/competences.

Based on the needs and interest on this topic, EPR will organise an online mutual learning exchange to share practices, including identifying key issues for members to build future collaboration.

## Learning objectives

- Current practices/initiatives promoting digital skills among EPR members
- Challenges experienced or key developments needed
- Proposals on how to pool expertise and collaborate in the future
